	 Executive: The Commission met on August 29. Topics discussed included the upcoming Stand Down event, bylaws, the Navy birthday celebration, and the Nomination Committee.

Veteran Observance Days:

 Commissioner Owens noted that the Veterans Observances in October were Navy Day on October 13 and the National Day of Deployment on October 26.

Veteran Memorial Building:

- Commissioner Farmer noted they are working to locate the documentation on the Oakland Veteran Memorial Building's transfer from the county to the city to confirm the terms.
- Priority is to resolve issues with the Oakland Veteran Memorial Building before moving forward with the Action Plan to enforce state law.
- The next meeting will be held via Zoom next Friday.

> PAL Legislation:

- Commissioner Phair noted that the California Legislature has adjourned for this session, so no further bills will be considered.
- SB54 Excludes VA disability pay from income calculations for court fee waivers (improves access for low-income veterans) passed.
- AB81 A study of women veterans' mental health; funding still needed in next budget .
- SB694 targeting deceptive practices by non-accredited benefit preparers, did not. We will revisit it next year and place it on the year-end agenda.

Comment: Anthony Simpson urged support for SB 694, emphasizing free accredited services, criticizing non-accredited fee-based groups, and noting accreditation is needed for proper VA claim representation.

 Commissioner Phair recommended placing SB 694 on the yearend agenda to consider a PAL request for Board of Supervisors support in the next legislative session (two-year bill).
 Additional note (Jaffin/Phair): California military retirement income—first \$20,000 state-tax exempt (Governor's trailer bill); phase-out thresholds at \$125k single / \$250k joint federal AGI.

Stand Down:

- Summit Estate Recovery Center has joined as a new partner, with their logo featured at the bottom of the revised flyer.
- The new flyer was presented, highlighting one of the new features: a raffle, shown at the bottom. Prizes will include phone cards, grocery cards, and gas cards. Commission members are encouraged to contribute if they would like to donate.

Comment: Jennifer mentioned that the CVSO will be donating gas cards.
