County IT staff's made the production of the video possible and they did a great job.</li> </ul>

		<ul> <li>Community engagement event on 8/24 Debrief. The luncheon was very well received by attendees. As far as the video that was a grant deliverable was concerned, Aida expressed her opinion that the video was too long and that in the future at least 3 commissioners should see what will be included in public presentations and to have a consensus on presenting. Susan offered to assist with editing and creating clips. Marie shared her sentiments that Nina spent many hours throughout July and August to get the video done and that the staff was only able to finish it the night before. Nina reminded everyone that Marie was the only commissioner that was available and offered to work on the video with her. Nina, Orly and Erin suggested using this grant deliverable preparation process as a learning opportunity. Due to the amount of time taken on the video during the meeting, Orly, Erin and Aliza shared that they wanted the conversation to move on in the agenda.
