

## Wildfires Do Not Wait - Neither Should You!

## California Wildfire Preparedness Week: May 5–11th

Wildfires move fast — sometimes giving you only minutes or seconds to act. They do not wait. They do not give second chances.

#### In 2024, California experienced:

- 8,024 wildfires reported
- Over 1 million acres burned
- More than 1,700 structures destroyed

Los Angeles County was hit especially hard, forcing thousands to evacuate with little warning. The message is clear: **Be ready before it happens.** 

### Did you know?

Embers can travel up to a mile ahead of a wildfire. Even homes outside the direct fire path can be at risk.

#### Be Wildfire READY with the 1–2–3 Checklist:

- Know Your Risk Find out if you live or work in a high-risk area.
- Make a Plan Create a simple household emergency plan.
- **Take Action** Build a kit, sign up for alerts, and practice your plan.

If told to evacuate — **GO IMMEDIATELY**. Do not wait. Your safety comes first.
